## Superintendent Comments

## Important Notes to our Parents:

If you drop off your child in the morning after 8:20 A.M, please come into the office and sign him/her in. It is very important that the teacher and the office have consistent information so that our records are accurate.

All students who require medication at school (over-the-counter or prescription drugs) must have a physicians' signed approval and also a parent's signed consent. These forms are in your Lisbon Grade School Parent/Student Handbook or may be obtained in the school office. In addition, parents are responsible for labeling all non-prescription drugs with the student's name, doctor's name and dosage. The medication should be kept in the nurse's office during school hours.

During the annual fire and safety drills, some students noted that they did not have working smoke detectors in their homes. The local fire department wanted to inform parents that they can provide smoke detectors free of charge to those families that do not have them. Please contact the fire department if you are interested in this service.

## Illinois Assessment Dates:



The state wide assessment test will be given April $9^{\text {th }}-20^{\text {th }}$. We ask parents to make sure that students have an adequate amount of rest and eat a good breakfast during testing week. Also, please avoid making appointments during this time, as students have to make up the tests) missed at a later date.

## Flu Season/Visiting Physicians

The Nurse Practitioner from the Newark Health Clinic's office will be here April $23^{\text {rd }}$ to do sports physicals for next year. Remember if your child plans to play in any sport they must have a current sport physical on file with the school office before beginning practices. The only exception will be for $6^{\text {th }}$ grade which must have a complete school physical before practicing. On March $1^{\text {st }}$ we will be having a dentist from Dentists $R$ Us here to do dental exams if you still need one for this school year or for next this is a good way to take care of this. Forms for both of these services will be coming home soon. If you have questions you can always call the office.

Just a reminder to parents; this is flu season. Flu-like symptoms include the following:

| Fever | Cough | Sore Throat |

| Runny Nose | Body Aches | Chills |
| Fatigue | Nausea/Vomiting | Diarrhea |



Also, please remember to help prevent the spread of the flu by doing the following:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after you cough or sneeze. When soap and water are not available, alcohol-based and antibacterial hand cleaners and wipes are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Cover your nose and mouth with tissue when you cough and sneeze. Throw the tissues in the trash after you use it. (or a shirt sleeve or elbow if no tissue is available)
Please watch for any flu-like symptoms in your children and keep them home until they are fever free for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medications.

## Fifth Grade News

Happy February! I cannot believe that the school year is going by so fast!
In reading, we are halfway through a unit in our textbook that highlights artists and inventors. We will be learning about special effects in movies and writing our own "Blues" music along with reading and performing a play. After we finish this unit, we will be reading a novel, Love that Dog. It is a book written in poetry form. We will be learning about poetry and writing our own. During conferences, you will be able to read our poetry books. We've also starting preparing for the PARCC exam. One way to help at home is to encourage your $5^{\text {th }}$ grader to read, read, and read.

In math, we are working on patterns. We've just finished decimals- adding, subtracting, dividing, and multiplying them. We review daily so that we get adequate practice. When we are finished with patterns, we will move onto fractions. ## News from Mrs. Scott

January has been a busy month in $6^{\text {th }}$ grade! In Reading, we just completed the novel, Number the Stars, by Lois Lowry. We had a lot of interesting discussions during this study and the students really enjoyed it! Coming soon... we will start working on some PARRC assessment practice passages in preparation for the tests that will be administered in the middle of April. We will also work on a variety of writing prompts to help each student do his/her best during the week of assessments. In Geography, we have learned about Europe and the differences between Eastern and Western European countries. We have been able to connect events in Number the Stars with historical events in Europe during the same World War II time period. In Science, we will be learning about rocks and minerals in our next unit. I am very proud of our $6^{\text {th }}$ graders and encourage all of them to continue to complete daily assignments and always do their best!

In $7^{\text {th }}$ grade Social Studies, we discussed the framework of the Constitution and how some of the goals of the founding fathers were achieved. We also learned about the qualifications for becoming an American citizen. The students even took a sample citizenship
test to get an idea of the written requirements. It was kind of interesting! We will be discussing the beginning of political parties, as well as Hamilton and Jefferson ideas. In our next chapter, we will be learning about American expeditions with Lewis and Clark. We have also been keeping informed about daily news events through our CNN Student News reports. The students are learning to be informed about what's going on around them. Keep up the good work, $7^{\text {th }}$ grade!

In $8^{\text {th }}$ grade Social Studies, we just completed our study of the Great Depression and the events leading up to World War II. We also started our unit on the Constitution. Each student was given a Constitution workbook and they will be responsible for completing daily assignments in it. We will do a variety of activities to help them learn all of the articles and amendments! Please encourage your student to participate in classroom discussions and review materials during this unit! # News from Mrs. Heap 

## Science Classes

Science classes are continuing to work on their curriculum. Eighth grade has been building ionic and molecular compounds out of marshmallows and toothpicks. They have also been preparing for the Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) that will be taken at the end of March. The ISA is a comprehensive exam that covers material from our $6^{\text {th }}$ through $8^{\text {th }}$ grade curriculum. We have been using IXL Science to review concepts from prior years. Seventh grade did a fantastic job presenting their Cell-O Jell-O projects to the entire school. In the coming weeks, they will be creating a "family" of pet monsters and diagraming how specific traits are passed down from generation to generation.

## Math

The month of February will bring a lot of excitement to math classes. The eighth grade Algebra class has just finished working with exponential functions and will begin working on $8^{\text {th }}$ grade geometry standards. Sixth and seventh grade will be mastering statistics and probability concepts over the next month. All junior high math classes have been using IXL.com to reinforce concepts learned in class. Classes are spending one class period per week preparing for PARCC testing. Since the test is completed on the computer, we are learning how to input equations, manipulate tools and diagrams, and use the technology to our advantage.

## Valentine's Party

The junior high Valentine's Day party will be Wednesday, February $14^{\text {th }}$. We will have an early pizza lunch at school and then skate at Skateland in Channahon during the afternoon. Students will return to school before 3 pm . A letter and permission slip will be sent home approximately a week before the trip. Parents who signed up to provide treats or pop for the party will be receiving a reminder letter in the next week.
