Kindergarten Registration:

Kindergarten registration for the 2019-2020 school year will be held at the school on Friday, April 12th from 1:30 - 2:30 P.M. During registration, the incoming kindergarten students are invited to visit the current kindergarten classroom.

While the children are in class, parents will go to the library to pre-register the students for the fall session. At this time, registration and enrollment forms need to be completed. Information needed to complete these cards include: names and telephone numbers of the child's doctor and dentist, phone numbers where the child's parents cards



numbers of the child's doctor and dentist, phone numbers where the child's parents can be reached during the day and a relative or neighbor whom the school should contact if unable to reach the parents.

To be eligible to attend kindergarten during the 2019-2020 school year: A child must be five years old on or before September 1, 2019 and <u>A certified copy of the child's birth</u> <u>certificate must be presented at the time of registration</u>. **Parents will also need to bring** with them two forms of residency identification that includes their name and physical address. Examples: A property tax bill, rental agreement, voter registration card, utility bill, credit card bill, etc. <u>Junk mail does not qualify</u>.

Parents will also receive physical, dental, and vision examination forms. Kindergarten students <u>will not be allowed to begin school in August</u> unless these forms have been completed and returned to the school.

School fees will be paid during the regular school registration days on either August 5^{th} or 8^{th} . Pre-registration of new kindergarten students allows the school to organize the kindergarten class and transportation schedule.

Sports Physicals:

Newark Healthcare Center is graciously doing sports physicals again for Lisbon Grade School on Thursday, April 4, 2019 at 12 PM. The fee for these physicals will be \$20 cash or check made payable to **Morris Hospital**. They are also offering an incentive and plan to "give back" to the school by offering the fees back to go towards the end of year character counts assembly. So if your student needs a sports physical for next year, this is a great way to free up an appointment for you plus help the school. All students participating in a school sport <u>must have a sports physical</u> before they participate with the exception of 6^{th} grade that must have a complete school physical prior to participating.



Recycle:

We want to encourage community members and parents to bring their old newspapers for the paper recycle bin and any clothing articles for the UsAgain clothing bin both on the south side of the building. These are both great ways to teach our students how to recycle and be environmentally smart.

Bus Notes:

The school requires that parents always write a note to the office or teacher if a student is to go home from school by a different method than normal. Often time's children get mixed up on dates or where they are to go if a note is not sent. Our policy is to have students follow the normal routine unless they have a note or the school receives a phone call from the parents.

8th Grade Graduation will be held on Wednesday, May 22nd at 7:00 P.M. Individual student pictures will be taken at 6:00 P.M. <u>All</u> 8th grade students must be here at 6:00 P.M.

Kindergarten Graduation:

Kindergarten Graduation will be held on Thursday, May 23rd at 10:00 A.M.in the gym with the traditional kindergarten picnic to follow.

Valedictorian & Salutatorian <u>April 2019</u>



Second Grade News

We are ready to welcome spring in second grade! We are tired of gray dreary days. Sunshine, warmer weather and being outside are some of the things we are looking forward to. We have been looking for signs of spring. We were pretty excited to start seeing robins out our window last week. Please check the weather in the morning before school so you know whether you need to send your child in a coat. Weather can be so unpredictable, and we usually are outside for recess.

I am trying to introduce the students to different types of writing. Usually we find one type of book that appeals to us, and we don't venture out of that area. As I help the students find their books for their cereal box book reports, I will try to find them books that challenge them or are different than what they usually read. We need five more cereal boxes before we can start our book reports. Thank you in advance for your help with this project!

This quarter we will begin to learn the cursive capital letters. It is a very exciting time for second graders. Please remind your child to practice the cursive letters that we have learned at home. Joining the letters to form words is especially difficult. The idea that you

can't lift up your pencil when writing a word is challenging some of the students. In spelling we will be learning to write the words in print and cursive. On the tests, though, I will only grade the printed words.

We will spend the month of April learning about eggs, chickens, incubation, and embryology. Our eggs should arrive in the mail the second week of April. The class has been looking forward to it all year! It is a favorite unit of mine as well. Pretty soon everyone in the class will be "egg-sperts"!

Keep encouraging your child to read in his/her spare time. As the weather warms up it is hard to keep everyone reading! We compared our latest fluency check to the one we took previously. Some students went down in the number of words read per minute. This indicates to me that students need to be reading more and challenging themselves to read harder material. Be on the lookout for information regarding the Book-It pizza party if your child completed all six months of the program.

This week we have been reading <u>Flat Stanley</u> and writing our letters. I will mail our letters over break. When Stanley returns please send him in to share his adventures with the class.

We have several students who are finishing up the Book-It program.

They've earned one personal pan pizza every month, and by completing the whole program, they will participate in a school wide pizza party. Nice job! We've also finished Ozzie's Reading Club. Our participants were **Zach Zabel, Logan Bols, Jorgen Friestad, and David Monsess**. They read an extra 90 minutes every two weeks which is a total of 360 minutes in 8 weeks- in addition to the rest of the reading required! Great job, book worms! Reading does lead to success!

We are gearing up for our **IAR exam**. We will begin the week of the 15^{th.} We've been practicing both math and reading in class almost daily. I will send home a note beforehand to remind you of our testing dates and when students can bring in snacks for extra fuel. We will also be taking the NGSS state science exam on April 26th. Currently in Science, we are studying taste- most specifically sour, spicy, and other flavors. Ask your fifth grader

about what they've learned and experienced. We've also conducted a lab using the pH scale.

We are starting our **Annual Wax Museum Project**. Your student should have received a packet with due dates and what is expected. Currently, our goal date to present our projects and work is May 3rd. We will have to work around IAR testing, track meets, field trips, a music concert, and a band concert. Whew! It has been a very busy March! Hopefully, we will be enjoying some nice, Spring weather soon! In Reading, we are continuing to prepare for the IAR testing which will be administered in April. We have also been working on daily journal prompts that have sparked great creativity in our class! I am very pleased with the effort in writing on these assignments! In Geography, we have been studying about Africa. The students will be choosing a country and will be researching various facts to make a presentation for the class, similar to the format we used for the Europe projects. The students have been learning a lot about landforms, deserts, rivers and the names of the countries that make up Africa. In Science, we have learned about the characteristics necessary to classify minerals, as well as the three types of rocks. We have also been looking at various rock samples and learning to identify them based on a variety of methods.

In 7th grade Social Studies, we have been discussing the Industrial Revolution, Westward expansion and Jacksonian Democracy. We continue to watch CNN Student News each day and the students are learning to take notes and recall information on daily quizzes.

In 8th grade Social Studies, we have just completed our unit on the U.S. Constitution. This is a requirement for 8th grade graduation and everyone did a great job staying on task and working through all of the material we needed to cover. It has been a lot of fun teaching this group and I am very proud of all of them on this accomplishment!

Math classes are busy preparing for the IAR (Illinois Assessment of Readiness) test. Each day, we will be working on a combination of problem solving and review. After we conquer the IAR, sixth grade will work on getting acquainted with using integers while seventh grade becomes more fluent solving algebraic equations. Eighth grade will have an added bonus of mastering operations with polynomial. Remember that all LGS students can practice math on IXL.com wherever there is an internet connection. Take advantage of this great tool to help reinforce concepts learned in class.

Seventh grade science class has finished presenting their 3rd quarter projects. In the 4th quarter, we will focus on the systems of the human body, which includes memorizing certain bones in the body and the ever popular cow eyeball dissection. Eighth grade science class will be preparing for the Illinois Science Assessment. After the ISA, students will start their final project on a "Sound and Light" topic of their choice. The projects require using different applications, including Word, Excel, and Power Point software. Everyone will be using the classroom laptops to complete the projects.
