We will also be preparing for our graduation program through the month of May. We hope you can join us on Thursday, May 23rd for graduation, as we celebrate our Kindergarten year!



IAR Testing went well and I was very proud of the effort everyone gave during all of the tests! We started a new novel this week and there will be a lot of fun discussion, projects and a movie at the end!

In Geography, we are working through our unit about Africa. Each student chose a country in Africa to research. These projects were presented during class and we all learned a lot about many different countries! It was another good experience to present information to our classmates and it taught us how to be in front of a class, too! We also got to try a nice variety of African recipes, too! In Science, we completed a chapter on rocks and minerals and are also finishing up our study of Plate Tectonics. Next week, we will start a unit on earthquakes and volcanoes and we will finish the year learning about the solar system.

In 7th grade Social Studies, we have been learning about westward expansion. We will also be studying about the effects of slavery and life during the 1800's leading up to the Civil War. We will be talking about early education methods. The students will be creating McGuffey Readers and have the opportunity to present them to our K-1st grade classes. That is always a fun day for the 7th graders! We have quite a bit of interesting material to cover during the last month of school!

In 8th grade Social Studies, we have been learning about WWII, including factors that led Hitler to take the paths he did, the history behind the Manhattan Project and also various battles that led to the conclusion of the war. During the last several weeks, we will be completing a unit on the Cold War and will be studying changes in American life during the Civil Rights Movement. I have really enjoyed working with all of the students at Lisbon Grade School! Thank you so much for your support throughout this year!

IAR tests are over, and we are all proud of our students for working so hard! Way to go! They all enjoyed the board game breaks in between tests.

The sixth graders are finishing units on friendly letters and business letters. Next, they will start their Ancient Civilizations research papers. After

completing a final draft and learning to write an MLA-style bibliography, we will finish the year by learning about persuasive advertising strategies.

The seventh grade research papers on medieval times topics have been very



interesting. They learned about MLA format, the note-taking process, avoiding plagiarism, and bibliographies. We just finished final drafts and will be doing a unit on persuasive strategies in infomercials next. In reading, the seventh graders are enjoying their literature circle groups. This involves reading a novel in small groups and completing different jobs that help with comprehension such as summarizing, finding important quotes, and defining tricky words.

The eighth graders have finished learning about verbals and verbal phrases. We have just started learning about verb moods before finishing the year with some fun writing activities like fan fiction and PSAs. In reading, the eighth graders are working on literature circle books. They boys picked a Korean mythology novel, and the girls picked a book that explores what life becomes when a large asteroid hits the moon and permanently changes the weather and tides. They will end the year working in groups to solve a lunch room food fight mystery. This will involve analyzing evidence from reliable and unreliable witnesses and determining punishment for the guilty students.

The last day to earn points for AR rewards is May 10th. However, 8th graders have until May 17th to finish their second book, and 7th grade has until May 24th to complete their second book for the quarter. Congratulations to everyone who went above and beyond the 2 book requirement each quarter and earned great prizes. Keep reading over the summer! I know I am going to get a hard start on the Rebecca Caudill nominees!
