
7th Grade Miss Zielske

After learning how to use quotation marks and commas correctly, the students applied what they learned while writing several narrative stories using quotes. They had plenty of interesting ideas for their stories! Also, students are working hard on their Genius Hour projects and will be presenting in February. It is really fun to learn about the topics students selected, and they enjoy choosing how they get to present their information. Seventh grade finished up their argument writing unit by completing an essay on someone or something they thought was the "Greatest of All Time." We worked on using effective evidence and how to address counterclaims.

In Reading, we are working on folktales and tall tales before moving on to a unit involving technological threats.
